STALLION SERVICE AUCTION (SSA)

Stallions whose service is offered for sale through the Illinois Quarter Horse Association Stallion Service Auction, must be owned or leased by an Illinois resident(s) and starting with the 1997 SSA a Stallion that is owned by an out of State member, but standing the entire breeding season (Feb. 1st to July 1st) will be eligible.

1. The highest bidder shall be the buyer. If any dispute arises between bidders, the auctioneer reserves the right to recognize the party from whom he took the highest bid.
2. Payment shall be by cash or negotiable check, payable immediately after purchase of services. Any bids not paid the day of the Auction have 15 days to pay or the stallion services are considered not sold and will revert back to the advertised bid or \$350.00 whichever is greater.
3. The starting bid on stallion services must be at least 1/2 of that breeding year advertised fee, but not less than \$300 plus \$50 fee.
4. If a Stallion Service does not sell before the gavel drops, the Service fee reverts to the advertised breeding fee or \$300.00, whichever is greater, plus \$50.00 fee. All Stallions must be picked up and paid in full by April 1st following the SSA.
5. A Stallion owner may purchase his Stallion's service at the SSA and then has the right to sell the service to his customer, but must notify the I.Q.H.A. Futurity office immediately. A mare owner cannot sell a purchased breeding.
6. Services sold are for the current season, stallion owner to guarantee a live foal, only to the extent of one return in the following year of the same mare, or a substitute mare, in case of death or Vet-certified breeding unsoundness.
7. When an Illinois Stallion owner donates a second service to the SSA, **(1/02-Stallion owner to choose where net funds goes, either Closed Futurity or Amateur Jackpot Purse)** the second service must be sold for the same amount as the first. The winning bidder may take both services, if not, the second bidder will be given the option to buy the second service. If the first stallion donation sells, and the second does not, mare owners may purchase the second donation at the selling price of the first donation, before April 1st. From April 1st thru April 15th, the stallion owner may buy his own stallion donation. If the first donation sold for more than the stallion's advertised stud fee, the stallion owner pays the advertised fee and no more. The stallion owner is eligible for the mare owners closed futurity with the purchase of his own stallion's services. Therefore, a mare sheet must be filed with the Futurity office by August 1st of the SSA year.

8. To be eligible to use these services, a mare must be:
 - a. Registered with the A.Q.H.A., or the Jockey Club
 - b. Halter broken
 - c. In healthy and sound breeding condition.
9. Service purchasers will be responsible for board fees, transportation and any veterinary bills incurred.
10. All purchasers are required to be a current member of the Illinois Quarter Horse Association. (No residence required)
11. The resulting foal must be AQHA registered.
12. The Illinois Quarter Horse Association disclaims any liability for any injury, loss, or death to any stallions, mares and or foals.

STALLION OWNERS RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Stallion owners must agree to the following:
 - a. Breed mare in a manner consistent with his present breeding program, unless an alternative method is agreeable to mare owner(s).
 - b. Provide mare or mare and foal care, to what is consistent with that given to other outside mares or mares and foals.
 - c. Furnish mare owners with breeder's certificate upon notification of arrival of foal, or on receipt of Veterinary Certification of pregnancy, and Board Bill having been paid as agreed upon, for the foal resulting from the SSA breeding.
 - d. Re-breed mare or substitute mare in case of death of original mare, or in case of failure to conceive. Re-breed of mare will be one (1) year only and must be the year following the SSA purchase.
2. Stallion owners **will not** be held responsible for any accidental injury and/or death to mares and/or foals.

MARE OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Mare owners must agree to submit the following:
 - a. Photostat copy of the mare's registration papers.
 - b. Approximate foaling dates if mare is in foal.
 - c. Approximate breeding dates if mare is bred.
 - d. Information as to pregnancy condition of mare.
2. Mare owners must assume responsibility of all Board fees, Veterinary fees, transportation fees, and any other fees which may occur, upon the discretion of the stallion owner.
3. The mare that is used for the Stallion Service Auction breeding, must be duly registered in the AQHA or with the Jockey Club, and must be in sound breeding condition.
4. At the time of the service purchase, the mare owner is given a mare sheet, requiring the name of the mare to be used for the breeding and the breeding dates. This sheet is to be completed and sent to the Futurity office on or before August 1st, of the purchase year.
5. The mare owner must contact, personally, the stallion owner, prior to the mares arrival at the breeding farm.
6. The mare owner must submit coggins & current health papers.
7. Stallion fee adjustments will be credited to the ensuing year Stallion Service Auction only. Rebreed of mare will be one (1) year and must be the year following the SSA purchase. There are no refunds of monies paid for breedings purchased.

ILLINOIS QUARTER HORSE ASSOCIATION

BREEDERS FUTURITY DIVISION I

1. General provisions:
 - a. All foals must be the produce of stallions whose services have sold thru the IQHA Stallion Service Auction **in the year prior to foaling.**
 - b. All owners or persons making nominations must be current members in good standing of the Illinois Quarter Horse Association.
 - c. The handler in Halter classes must be the same person in multiple classes.
 - d. The rider in Performance classes must be the same person in each performance division. There may be a different rider for, Western Pleasure, English Pleasure or Reining.
 - e. A change of Handler or Rider can only be made if the Futurity Committee is notified and agrees to the change.
 - f. There will be NO 2 yr. old reining class held. All horses must be paid up in this class as 2 yr. olds to be eligible for the 3 yr. old reining class.
 - g. A rider may ride up to 3 horses in the 3 yr. old Reining futurity class.
 - h. All reining scores will be announced after each run.
 - i. All 2 yr. old western pleasure futurity horses will be ridden in a snaffle bit.
 - j. National Snaffle Bit rules to apply with one exception: The horses may have been shown previous to the futurity with other than a snaffle bit.
 - k. **THERE ARE NO FUTURITY ENTRY FEE REFUNDS, OR MONIES ALLOWED TO BE MOVED FROM CLASS TO CLASS, OR HORSE TO HORSE.**

The ILLINOIS QUARTER HORSE ASSOCIATION BREEDER'S FUTURITY DIVISION I will be held each year at such place as may be designated by the IQHA Board of Directors. All classes will be judged by a qualified A.Q.H.A. Judge or Judges. A.Q.H.A. RULES TO PREVAIL.

OPEN WEANLING FUTURITY

1. To make a foal eligible to show in the open weanling futurity classes of the Illinois Quarter Horse Association Breeders Futurity the following conditions must be complied with:
 - a. The sire of the foal must have had his services sold through the IQHA Stallion Service Auction **in the year prior to foaling**. The sire and the dam of the foal must be registered in the AQHA or one of the parents can be registered in the Jockey Club.
2. Open Futurity payments are as follows:
 - a. A fee of \$25.00 must be paid to the IQHA office before March 15th of the year the foal is born. A balance of \$25.00 is due on or before June 1st of the same year.
 - b. Any entry postmarked after midnight March 15th, will be considered LATE and is subject to a \$25.00 LATE FEE per class per entry. No entries, with or without late fees will be accepted after the June 1st deadline EXCEPT!
 1. EXCEPT by paying a \$100.00 penalty plus entry fees of \$50.00. This payment will be accepted up to August 1st in the year the foal was born.
 - c. All weanling nominations must provide the birth date and sex of the foal before July 1st of foaling year. Failure to submit correct foaling information will place weanling in the Early Division. A copy of the foals registration papers or breeders certificate should be available at the Futurity Show.
 - d. The Illinois Quarter Horse Association reserves the right to inspect registration papers and to check all horses for color and correct markings.

YEARLING CLASSIFICATION - HALTER

1. Only colts, fillies and geldings duly nominated and entered (but not necessarily shown) in the previous year's weanling classes are eligible to continue nomination in the Yearling classification of the Illinois Quarter Horse Association Breeder's Futurity. The following conditions must be complied with.
 - a. A fee of \$25.00 must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office, on or before March 15th of the Yearling year.
 - b. A second and final payment of \$25.00 must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office, on or before June 1st of the Yearling year.
 - c. Any entry postmarked after midnight March 15th will be considered LATE and is subject to a LATE FEE of \$25.00 per Yearling, PLUS the regular fee. No entries, with or without late fees will be accepted after the June 1st deadline EXPECT!

<p>1. EXCEPT by paying a \$200.00 penalty plus entry fees of \$50.00. This payment will be accepted up to August 1st in the Yearling year.</p>

- d. The Illinois Quarter Horse Association reserves the right to inspect registration papers and to check all horses for color and correct markings.

TWO YEAR OLD CLASSIFICATION - HALTER

1. Only stallions, mares and geldings duly nominated and entered (but not necessarily shown) in the previous Illinois Quarter Horse Association Breeder's Futurity Weanling classes and Yearling classes are eligible to continue nomination in the Two Year old halter classes. To make a stallion, mare or gelding eligible to show in the Two Year old halter class, the following conditions must be complied with:
 - a. A fee of \$25.00 must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office on or before March 15th of the year the entry becomes a two year old.
 - b. A second and final payment of \$25.00 must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office on or before June 1st of the year the entry becomes a two year old.
 - c. Any entry postmarked after midnight March 15th will be considered LATE and is subject to a LATE FEE of \$25.00 each Two Year old, PLUS the regular fee. No entries, with or without late fees, will be accepted after the June 1st deadline EXCEPT!

1. EXCEPT, if the two year old had been paid up in full as a Weanling, it may be reinstated into this Futurity by paying a \$300.00 penalty PLUS entry fees of \$50.00 This payment will be accepted up to August 1st in the Two Year old year.
 - d. The Illinois Quarter Horse Association reserves the right to inspect registration papers and to check all horses for color and correct markings.

TWO YEAR OLD CLASSIFICATION - PERFORMANCE

Pg. 9

1. Only stallions, mares and geldings duly nominated and entered (but not necessarily shown) in the previous Illinois Quarter Horse Association Breeder's Futurity Weanling and Yearling classes are eligible to continue nomination in the Two Year old performance classes. To make a stallions, mares and gelding eligible to show in the Two Year old performance classes, the following conditions must be complied with:

- a. Three performance classes are offered, Snaffle Bit, HunterUnder Saddle and Reining (reining classes require payment as a two year old, to be eligible for nomination as a three year old , but do not show as a two year old.) A first payment fee of \$25.00 PER CLASS must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office on or before March 15th of the year the entry becomes a Two Year old.
- b. A second payment of \$25.00 PER CLASS must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office on or before May 1st of the year the entry becomes a Two Year old.
- c. A third and final payment of \$25.00 PER CLASS must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office on or before June 1st of the year the entry becomes a Two Year old.
- d. Entries of first payments, postmarked after midnight March 15th, will be considered LATE, and are subject to a LATE FEE of \$25.00 per entry, per class, PLUS the regular fee. Second payments postmarked after midnight May 1st, will be considered LATE, and a LATE FEE of \$25.00 per entry, per class, PLUS the regular fee. The third and final payment must be postmarked no later than June 1st. No entries with or without late fees will be accepted after the June 1st deadline EXCEPT!

<p>1. EXCEPT, if the two year old had been paid up in full as a weanling, it may be reinstated to this Futurity by paying a \$300.00 penalty plus entry fees of \$75.00 per class entered. This payment will be accepted up to August 1st within the two year old year.</p>

2. See page 11 for information to add a class on a horse having been paid in full thru the 2 Year Old year after the June 1st deadline.
- e. The Illinois Quarter Horse Association reserves the right to inspect registration papers and to check all horses for color and correct markings.

THREE YEAR OLD CLASSIFICATION - PERFORMANCE

Pg. 10

1. Only stallions, mares and geldings duly nominated and entered (but not necessarily shown) in the previous Illinois Quarter Horse Association Breeder's Futurity weanling classes, yearling classes and two year old classes are eligible to continue nomination in the Three Year performance classes. To make a stallion, mare or gelding eligible to show in the Three Year old performance classes, the following conditions must be complied with:

- a. Three performance classes are offered, Western Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle and Reining. The only classes a Three Year old is eligible for are those classes that were paid in full as a two year old. A first payment fee of \$25.00 PER CLASS must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office on or before March 15th of the year the entry becomes a Three Year old
- b. A second payment of \$25.00 PER CLASS must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office on or before May 1st of the year the entry becomes a Three Year old.
- c. A third and final payment of \$25.00 PER CLASS must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office on or before June 1st of the year the entry becomes a Three Year old.
- d. Entries of first payments, postmarked after midnight March 15th, will be considered LATE and are subject to a LATE FEE of \$25.00 per entry, per class, PLUS the regular fee. Second payments postmarked after midnight May 1st will be considered LATE and are subject to a LATE FEE of \$25.00 per entry, per class PLUS the regular fee. The third and final payment must be postmarked no later than June 1st. No entries, with or without late fees will be accepted after the June 1st deadline EXCEPT:

1. EXCEPT, if the 3 Year old had been paid up in full as a weanling it may be reinstated by paying a \$400.00 penalty plus entry fees of \$75.00 per class entered. This payment will be accepted up to Aug. 1st of their 3 Year old year.

- e. The Illinois Quarter Horse Association reserves the right to inspect registration papers and to check all horses for color and correct markings.

SPECIAL ADD A CLASS FOR TWO AND THREE YEAR OLDS

1. TWO YEAR OLD

- A. To add a class as a 2 Year old, that has been paid up in a class or classes, after the June 1st deadline and before the August 1st FINAL deadline, the fees will be as follows: the total entry fee, plus the late fee charges plus a \$100.00 penalty. Example: 2 Year Old paid up in Western and wants to add Hunter Under Saddle Entry fee of \$75.00 plus 3 late fees of \$25.00 each (total \$75.00) plus the penalty \$100.00 or a Grand Total of \$250.00 to add the class.

2. THREE YEAR OLD

- A. To add a class as a 3 Year Old, that has been paid up in a class or classes and now wants to add a class that was not paid as a 2 Year Old, the fees would be as follows: the 2 Year Old entry fees, the 2 Year Old late fees, the \$100.00 penalty, the 3 Year Old entry fees and any applicable late fees. Example: Entry paid up as a 2 Year Old in Western Pleasure and now as a 3 Year Old wants to add Reining before the June 1st deadline, the fee will be \$75.00 plus \$75.00 plus \$100.00 for the missed 2 Two Year payments, and the \$75.00 plus \$25.00 late fee for each payment deadline missed, if the March 15th and May 1st were missed a Grand Total of \$375.00 would be due.

EXHIBITION RULES

1. HALTER DIVISION;

- a. The OPEN weanling classification will be separated into four classes: Early Fillies, Late Fillies and Early Colts, Late Colts. All weanlings will be shown in hand.
- b. Classes will be determined by birth date. Failure to submit correct birth date will place the foal in the early class.
- c. The first and second place weanling in each class will be considered the Grand and Reserve Weanling in their division. There will be no over-all Grand & Reserve in the Weanling division.
- d. The CLOSED weanling classification will be separated into two divisions, Stallion Owner and Mare Owner. There will be two classes in each division: Stallion Owner Colt Class - Stallion Owner Filly Class - Mare Owner Colt Class and Mare Owner Filly Class. All weanlings will be shown in hand.
- e. The YEARLING classification will be separated into three classes: Fillies, Colts and Geldings. All Yearlings to be shown in hand.
- f. The TWO YEAR OLD classification will be separated into three classes: Fillies, Colts and Geldings. All Two Year olds to be shown in hand.

EXHIBITION RULES

PERFORMANCE DIVISION

1. TWO YEAR OLDS:

- a. The two year old classification can be shown in two classes: Snaffle Bit and Hunter Under Saddle. The Hunter Under Saddle class will be shown both ways of the ring at all three gaits under AQHA rules. The Snaffle Bit class will be shown under Snaffle Bit rules with one exception; the horse may be shown previous to the Futurity with other than a snaffle.
- b. There will be NO 2 Year old Reining class.

2. THREE YEAR OLDS:

- a. The three year old classification can be shown in three classes: Western Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle and Reining. Western Pleasure and Hunter Under Saddle classes will be shown both ways of the ring at all three gaits, under AQHA rules. The Reining class will show at the pattern posted by the Judges, under AQHA rules. A rider may ride up to three horses in the Reining class.

PRIZE FUND AND RULES**

1. The value of the prize fund of the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY DIV. I will be total monies paid in fees (regular and late), added donations and miscellaneous funds, plus net proceeds from IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY SSA DIVISION I.
2. From the total of the SSA, 20% is withheld, 15% for operating expenses, 5% for the Closed Futurity Purse. The balance is then divided as follows: 30% (1/3 for Open - 2/3 for Closed) for the Weanling Purse, 30% for the Yearling Purse, 10% for the 2 Year Old Halter Purse, 10% for the 2 Year Old Performance classes and 20% for the 3 Year Old Performance classes.

SIRE AND DAM AWARDS ELIMINATED IN 1987.

HIGH MONEY EARNING HORSE OF THE FUTURITY

1. An award of \$250.00 will be given to the owner of the Three Year old horse that has compiled the highest cash earning from the Futurity over the 4 years of eligibility in the Futurity. This award will be paid to the owner of the horse at the time of its completion of eligibility.
2. An award of \$200.00 will be given to the owner of the Sire of the High Money Earning Horse. They must have been the owner of the Sire at the time of breeding.
3. An award of \$200.00 will be given to the owner of the Dam of the High Money Earning Horse. They must have been the owner of the Dam at the time of breeding.
4. The Futurity Division I secretary will record the winnings each year of the horses eligibility in the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY DIVISION I. The horse that earned the highest total money during the 4 years will be given the award. In case of a tie, the money will be split.
5. Money for this award will come from interest earned by Futurity Division I investment account and may be changed at the discretion of the Futurity Division I committee. This award begins with the 1981 Futurity Show.

HALTER DIVISION

1. OPEN WEANLING HALTER CLASSIFICATION PURSE:

- a. Starting with the 1989 SSA, 1/3 of the 30% net proceeds from the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY SSA DIVISION I, 100% net weanling entry fees, net miscellaneous funds and net added donations. Total weanling purse to be distributed as follows:
 1. 10% of the Weanling classification purse is to be withheld and added to the Yearling classification purse the year the entry becomes a Yearling.
 2. 10% of the Weanling classification purse is to be withheld and added to the Two Year old classification purse, the year the entry becomes a Two Year old.
 - a. 1/3 to the halter division.
 - b. 2/3 to the performance division. Changed for 1997 SSA (Purse to be divided by total number of horses entered in this division. This dollar amount is owned by each entry and will be multiplied by the number of horse in each division to get purse money for that division.)
 3. 10% of the Weanling classification purse is to be withheld and added to the Three Year old classification purse for the year the entry becomes a Three Year old.
 - a. 1/3 to Western Pleasure. Changed for 1997 SSA
 - b. 1/3 to Hunter Under Saddle. Changed for 1997 SSA
 - c. 1/3 to Reining class (held only when 3 Year Old.) Changed for 1997 SSA

(Purse to be divided by total number of horses entered in this division. This dollar amount is owned by each entry and will be multiplied by the number of horse in each division to get purse money for that division.)
4. Balance of funds is the Weanling Halter Purse.

HALTER DIVISION

1. YEARLING HALTER CLASSIFICATION PURSE:

- a. 30% net proceeds from the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY STALLION AUCTION, DIVISION I, 100% net Yearling fees, net added donations and net miscellaneous funds, plus 100% of the prior years weanling purse, is the total Yearling purse to be distributed as follows:

1. 10% of the Yearling classification purse to be withheld and added to the 2 Year classification purse for the year the entry becomes a 2 Year Old.

- a. 1/3 to 2 Year Halter classes.

- b. 2/3 to 2 Year performance classes distributed as follows:

1/3 to 2 Year Snaffle Bit Changed for 1997 SSA

1/3 to 2 Year Hunter Under Saddle Changed for 1997 SSA

1/3 to Reining class (held only when 3 Year Old) Changed for 1997 SSA

(Purse to be divided by total number of horses entered in this division. This dollar amount is owned by each entry and will be multiplied by the number of horse in each division to get purse money for that division.)

2. 10% of the Yearling classification purse to be withheld and added to the 3 Year classification purse for the year the entry becomes a 3 Year Old.

- a. 3 Year performance classes distributed as follows.

1/3 to 3 Year Western Pleasure Changed for 1997 SSA

1/3 to 3 Year Hunter Under Saddle Changed for 1997 SSA

1/3 to Reining Changed for 1997 SSA

(Purse to be divided by total number of horses entered in this division. This dollar amount is owned by each entry and will be multiplied by the number of horse in each division to get purse money for that division.)

3. Balance of funds are the Yearling Halter Purse.

- a. 10% net proceeds from IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY SSA DIVISION I, 100% net performance division Two Year old entry fees, net miscellaneous funds and net added donations plus 10% of weanling classification purse the year the entry was a weanling and 10% of Yearling purse, the year the entry was a Yearling, is the total 2 Year old classification purse to be distributed as follows:

1. 10% of the Two Year old classification purses are to be withheld and added to the 3 Year old purses for the year the entry is a 3 Year old. distributed as follows:

- a. 1/3 to 3 Year old Western Pleasure Changed for 1997 SSA
- b. 1/3 to 3 Year old Hunter Under Saddle Changed for 1997 SSA
- c. 1/3 to 3 Year old Reining Changed for 1997 SSA

1. 3 YEAR OLD PERFORMANCE CLASSIFICATION PURSE:

- a. 20% net proceeds from IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY SSA DIVISION I, 100% net performance division Three Year old entry fees, net miscellaneous funds and net added donations, plus 10% Weanling classification purse (the year the entry was a Weanling), plus 10% Yearling classification purse (the year the entry was a Yearling), plus 10% HALTER DIVISION Two Year old classification purse (the year the entry was a Two Year old), plus 10% PERFORMANCE DIVISION Two Year old classification purse (the year the entry was a Two Year old), is the total performance division Three Year old Classification purse.

CHANGES STARTING WITH THE 1997 S.S.A.

Starting with the 1997 SSA, monies from the 1997 SSA for the 2 and 3 year olds will be distributed into the Snaffle Bit/Western Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle and Reining by the number of entries in each class.

PURSE DISTRIBUTION

1. HALTER DIVISION

- a. Monies will be paid from 1st to 10th place with ribbons presented from 1st to 15th place.

2. PERFORMANCE DIVISION

- b. Monies will be paid from 1st to 10th place with ribbons presented from 1st to 15th place.

**CLOSED WEANLING FUTURITY
(ILLINOIS RESIDENTS ONLY THRU WEANLINGS OF 1996)
OPEN TO ANY MARE OWNER AS OF THE SSA 1996/WEANLINGS OF 1997**

1. The Closed Futurity Weanling classification will be separated into two division, Stallion owner and Mare owner. There will be two classes in each division as follows:
 - a. Stallion owners Colt class.
 - b. Mare owners Colt class.
 - c. Stallion owners Filly class.
 - d. Mare owners Filly class.
2. Stallion owners whose donated Stallion Service sells are eligible to enter one Closed Futurity foal. If they donate a second service, which sells, they are eligible to enter two Closed Futurity foals, by following eligibility and payment deadlines.
3. Stallion owner has the right to name the foal to be shown in the Closed Stallion Owners class the day before this class is held. Foal may be owned by another party, but must have been foaled in ILLINOIS (or may use out of state mare owners foal starting in 1997) and must be paid in FULL in the Open and Stallion owner must have paid the Closed entry. Entry fees must have been paid by the entry deadlines.
4. A Mare owner (can be Illinois or out of State as of the 1996 SSA resulting foals) who purchases the services of a Stallion through the Stallion Service Auction is entitled to one Closed Futurity foal entry. The mare owner must name the mare whose foal will be eligible by August 1st of the breeding year. The foal must be paid in FULL in the Open and the Closed. Entry fees must have been paid by the entry deadlines.
5. The Stallion owner may enter the Mare owner division ONLY if he purchases and retains his own Stallion breeding through the SSA. If the Stallion owner is eligible for the Mare owner division, he must follow eligibility and payment deadlines, the same as a mare owner.

CLOSED WEANLING FUTURITY

1. To make a foal eligible to show in the Closed Weanling Futurity of the Illinois Quarter Horse Association Breeders Futurity, the following conditions must be complied with:
 - a. The foal must be paid up in the Open division of the Weanling futurity and all eligibility rules and payments must be complied with.

CLOSED FUTURITY PAYMENTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- a. A fee of \$25.00 must be paid to the IQHA Futurity office before March 15th of the year the foal is born. A balance of \$25.00 is due on or before June 1st of the same year.
- b. Any entry postmarked after midnight March 15th, will be considered LATE and is subject to a \$25.00 LATE FEE per class, per entry, PLUS the regular fee per class per entry. No entries, with or without late fees will be accepted after June 1st deadline EXCEPT.

<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. EXCEPT by paying a \$100.00 penalty, plus entry fees of \$50.00. This payment will be accepted up to August 1st in the year which the foal was born.

CLOSED WEANLING HALTER CLASSIFICATION PURSE:

1. Starting with the 1989 SSA 2/3 of the 30% (see page 14) and 5% net proceeds from the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY SSA DIVISION I, PLUS MONIES (less 15% to the General Fund) from the second service sold, 100% net Closed weanling entry fees, net miscellaneous funds and net added donation less 20% Office Charge and added money from Interest on the Futurity Division I investment account, 1/2 of the Interest to the Closed Futurity and 1/2 of the Interest will be used for operating expenses.
2. The Mare owner division of the Colt and Filly classes will pay fifteen places each class.
3. The Stallion owner division of the Colt and Filly classes will pay ten places each class.

**CLOSED 2 YEAR OLD SNAFFLE BIT FUTURITY
(Illinois Residents Only ***Until 1996 SSA)**

1. Starting with the 1990 Stallion Service Auction (SSA) a new CLOSED 2 YEAR OLD SNAFFLE BIT FUTURITY has been established. Foals resulting from the 1990 donated and purchased breeding are eligible.
2. Closed eligibility rules will be the same as the Weanling Closed rules: MUST be paid up as a Weanling, Yearling and Illinois owned, Illinois foaled, **until the resulting foals from the 1996 SSA are eligible, then out of state mare owners are eligible.**
 - a. The Mare owner entry will be the designated foal used for the Mare Owners Closed Weanling Futurity.
 - b. The Stallion owner has the choice of any ELIGIBLE 2 Year Old by his stallion. If two SSA services were sold, then two entries will be eligible. Stallion owner must name his entry by June 1st in the year the Snaffle Bit class will be held.
3. CLOSED FUTURITY SNAFFLE BIT CLASS PAYMENTS:
 - a. An entry fee of \$125.00 per entry must be paid by June 1st of the 2 Year Old year. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 1st.
4. CLOSED FUTURITY 2 YEAR OLD SNAFFLE BIT CLASSIFICATION PURSE:
 - a. Starting with the 1990 SSA, a purse of \$1,500.00 will be designated for the Closed 2 Year Old Snaffle Bit (first year purse donated by IQHA and the future years purse will be deducted from the Closed Weanling Futurity purse) plus 2 Year Old Snaffle Bit entry fees, net miscellaneous fees and any added donations, less 20% Office Charge.
 - b. Monies will be paid to 10 places.

OWNER RESPONSIBILITY

1. If a Quarter Horse that is duly nominated and entered in the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY DIVISION I is sold, it is the RESPONSIBILITY of the seller to notify the purchaser of the Futurity Status of said Quarter Horse and the RESPONSIBILITY of the seller to notify the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY DIVISION I Secretary as the proper name and address of the new owner of the eligible horse.

IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY COMMITTEE DIVISION I RESPONSIBILITY

1. It is the responsibility of the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY DIVISION I COMMITTEE, to govern Division I of the IQHA BREEDERS FUTURITY according to rules set forth herein.

IQHA BOARD OF DIRECTORS RESPONSIBILITY

1. It is the responsibility of the IQHA Board of Directors, to approve or disapprove any and all rule changes presented to the IQHA Board of Directors by the IQHA Breeders Futurity Committee, Division I,
2. The IQHA Board of Directors reserves the right to amend these rules and regulations upon due notice to all owners then participating in the program.
3. The IQHA Board of Directors reserves the right that any dispute about ambiguities in the rules or any disputes requiring interpretation of the rules and regulations will be resolved by the IQHA Board of Directors.
4. The Illinois Quarter Horse Association takes the position that the Auction is essentially a service provided by the Association, and that the Association bears no responsibility for any injuries to the horses, and that the Association provides no guarantee of a live foal.
